#### **VOCATIONAL TRAINING CENTER**



Since the learners are few, they are able to produce items like tables, ox-carts and lay cement bricks for construction. VTC continue with learning in (a) carpentry and joinery (b) metal work and fabrications and Bricks laying and concrete practices.

#### LIVELIHOOD

For time immemorial the pastoralists around Holy Trinity Peace Village Kuron have been using traditional method of farming. The women plays the greatest role in the family, from provision of food to the construction of mud huts. For tilling the land, they use the traditional hoe (Emelek) which could not do much. The introduction of the ox-plough picked up very well and the women are happy that now they will have plenty of food for the family and where possible will sell some for other provisions.

Ms Adele Nakwar one of the beneficiaries was very happy and proud saying that with the plough she will have enough food on the table. She continue by saying that after digging her garden, she will dig for others and she will be paid by goats. She urge the youth to make use of the donkey-plough to earn money which can be used to buy cows instead of raiding where lives are lost. Thanks to Caritas Austria for supporting this Project.

# THE ROAD

Holy Trinity is the only active Institution based in Kapoeta East county and between Boma State. One of the challenges is the road trips from Boma - Kuron - Narus - Kapoeta. Though we have been maintaining the road for the last twenty years with support from donors and partners, there is need for continuous maintenance. The road is accessible during the dry season but becomes a challenge during the rainy season. Other Organisations use the road to deliver services like food and medicine to the communities in the area but the Peace Village is struggles to maintain the road e.g. filling the potholes and building of earth bridges with gabions within the Kuron catchments. Therefore other areas outside our catchment remains the biggest challenge as sawn below. We urge the rest of the Institutions to join hands with Kuron to repair the road which is outside the Kuron catchments.

There was extraordinary flood which destroyed most parts of the road especially along the streams which have been constructed with earth bridge and gabions, therefore continuous maintenance is required.

#### KURON PRIMARY HEALTH CENTRE

The centre continue with basic quality health care services to children and adult and pregnant mothers through continuous health education, curative treatment and offering aseptic delivery procedures to expecting mothers at the facility. Patients are attended to by a Clinical officer and where necessary tests are carried out before being dispensed.

# **MY LIFE AND THE PEACE VILLAGE - KURON**



Just like any other young boy coming from the pastoral community of the Toposa, the life expected in a youth is always growing up to take care of the cattle until the adolescence stage. When reaching that stage, you are expected to man up and carry a rifle and go on deadly expedition of cattle raiding. This is an incidence whereby you may raid the cattle of the nearby community by killing the shepherds and driving away their cattle or be killed.

My story is different from that. Sometimes I am puzzled with the kind of miracle that happened to me. I am from a humble family background. My parents have never received a formal education though my father was a catechist and we are ten siblings and I am the only child who went to school.

I studied my primary education in a missionary school managed by the Saint Patrick's missionaries. Thereafter I joined high school in Turkana, Kenya Supported by the same missionaries. After my high school, I got a job at Holy Trinity Peace Village Kuron to work in the Peace department because of my knowledge in the native language. Although I loved what I was doing, I had the urge to continue with studies and be professional, but the obstacle was the funding. With the help of the Peace Village administration, the founder and some donors, I enrolled for a three years Bachelor Degree in Peace Building and Development Studies at the Protestant University of Rwanda in October 2017.

My aim was to work hard and attain the best grades, not only to appreciate the founder, but also to make sure I represent positively the Kauto Community. As I write we are only three University graduates in the whole of Kauto community that has a population of about a million people. After working so hard in my studies, I got a scholarship to study in Duale Hochshule Baden Wurttemberg in Germany for a semester. I completed it successfully and came back to the Peace Village in August 2020 to ensure that I give back the knowledge to my people the community in Kauto. I aspire that my community will be uplifted from their current status.

I give my gratitude and appreciation to Holy Trinity Peace Village Kuron, the donors, the staff and to all who made my studies successful not forgetting my parents who gave me chance to study.

The presence of the Peace Village in Kuron is a blessing not only to me but to the Toposa community in Kauto, the neighboring communities of the Nyangatom, Jie, Murle and the Kachipo which the organization is working hard to uplift. I would want to say that my life will never be the same again and this is because of the Holy Trinity Peace Village, Kuron.

I have given my whole self to ensure that the Vision and the dreams of the founder is realized.
